The Gross Revenue per traffic train mile was 8s. 3·03d., by comparison with 6s. 8·94d. in the preceding year, and with 7s. 4·81d. in 1913-14.

and as the Gross Revenue per train mile in 1905-6 represented the maximum earnings per train mile obtained in a period of 28 years, the result obtained in 1915-16, viz., 8s. 3·03d., is the best achieved during the past 38 years.

Working Expenses of the Railways.

Excluding special and abnormal charges, the percentage of Working Expenses to Gross Revenue was 64·94, by contrast with 72·76 in the preceding year, and with 67·36 in 1913-14.

In view of the exceptional conditions occasioned by the war, every effort was made to minimize expenditure as far as was consistent with safety and the provision of a reasonable measure of convenience to the public, and as a result thereof the ordinary Working Expenses were less by £50,278 than in 1914-15, despite the

fact that it was necessary to incur an expenditure of £42,141 on the following items which were not operative in the preceding year, viz. :—

Percentage of Net Revenue to Capital Liability.

The Net Revenue after providing for the payment of the Ordinary Working Expenses, the Special and Abnormal Charges, and the Pensions and Gratuities was equivalent to 2.93 per cent. of the total loan liability.

Payment Received under the Provisions of Section 102 of Act No. 2716.

In conformity with the provisions of Section 102 of Act No. 2716, an amount of £7,620 14s. 7d. was appropriated by Parliament and paid to the Department to make good the decrease in revenue occasioned by the carriage at reduced rates of Victorian Coal purchased by the general public.

Railway Accident and Fire Insurance Fund.

The total amount credited to the Railway Accident and Fire Insurance Fund, inclusive of a contribution of £128 in respect of the St. Kilda and Brighton Electric Tramway, was £28,654, but the money at the credit of the fund was not sufficient to cover the payments made thereout (*vide* Appendix No. 7), and a temporary advance of £7,790 was accordingly obtained from the Public Account in conformity with the provisions of Section 111 of Act No. 2716.

Pensions and Gratuities.

The amounts paid in pensions and gratuities (to ex-employees or to their dependent relatives) were £107,995 and £13,337 respectively, or a total of £121,332, as compared with £105,685 and £17,753 respectively, or a total of £123,438, in the preceding year.

The number of employees in the Service on 30th June, 1916, who were entitled to either pension or compensation, was 1,193, by contrast with 1,317 at 30th June, 1915, *vide* Appendix No. 8.

The increase in the Working Expenses was mainly due to charges incurred in connexion with the duplication of the line between the Power House and Brighton Beach, heavy renewals of the track, increased car mileage, and the payment of higher wages to the staff.

Reconciliation with Treasury Figures.

The figures relating to the Revenue and Working Expenses as embodied in our accounts do not coincide with the figures quoted by the Treasury, because it is customary, in accordance with ordinary commercial practice, to credit the Revenue Account of each year with all the moneys which have been *earned* in such year, whether *received* in such year or not, and in like manner to debit the Working Expenses Account with the expenditure incurred during the same period; whereas in the Treasury it is the practice to credit or debit each year with the amounts actually received or paid during the year.

A reconciliation thereof has accordingly been embodied in Appendix No. 12, so that the apparent discrepancies between the two sets of figures may be readily appreciated.

Live Stock Traffic.

In consequence of the cessation of the movement of starving stock, and the depletion of flocks and herds occasioned by the drought, the revenue derived from the carriage of live stock was £139,744 less than that of the preceding year, or equivalent to 30·63 per cent., whilst the tonnage showed a decrease of 262,257 tons, or equivalent to a reduction of 36·65 per cent.

The Harvest.

The wheat yield, viz., 58,521,706 bushels, was much greater than in any previous season, the former record, in 1910–11, being only 34,813,019 bushels.

In consequence, however, of a lack of shipping the total quantity of grain hauled by the Department up till 30th June only amounted to 10,636,428 bags, which left a balance of 6,146,482 bags at country stations, whilst of the grain which had been brought to the seaboard 3,878,844 bags were stacked at and in the vicinity of Williamstown, and 1,786,694 bags at Geelong.

It became necessary owing to the abnormal yield and the exceptional conditions which prevailed to establish additional stacking sites at a number of country stations, and to acquire certain areas of private land, and construct additional sidings near Newport in order to provide adequate accommodation for the storage of grain at the seaboard.

The provision of the additional stacking sites and sidings involved a total expenditure of £25,036, of which £23,761 was a charge against Capital and £1,275 against Working Expenses.

New Lines of Railways.

During the year 225·34 miles of new railways were opened for traffic, and at 30th June, last, 138·50 miles were in course of construction. The details of the different lines are shown in Appendix No. 13.

Electrification of the Suburban Railways.

The inauguration of electric traction has been retarded by the difficulties which have been experienced in obtaining the electrical equipment for the sub-stations and the Newport Power Station, because the workshops in England of Messrs. Siemens Brothers' Dynamo Works Limited, by whom the equipment was to have been supplied, were requisitioned by the Imperial Government for the manufacture of munitions. In order to lessen the delay in the completion of the scheme Mr. E. B. Jones proceeded to England in June last, and as a result of his visit it is now anticipated that sufficient plant will be received to admit of the Sandringham-Essendon and Flemington Racecourse lines being electrically operated in January, 1918, and the Williamstown, Williamstown Racecourse, Port Melbourne, and St. Kilda lines at brief intervals thereafter.

The electrical apparatus is in process of erection in the sub-station buildings at Newmarket and Newport, whilst the sub-stations at Middle Brighton, North Fitzroy, and Princes'-bridge are ready for the installation of the equipment as soon as it arrives from England.

The high-tension cables have been laid between the Newport Power Station and the sub-stations at Newmarket, Newport, and Princes'-bridge, and the work is in progress between the Princes'-bridge and Middle Brighton sub-stations.

The overhead equipment has been installed on the Flemington Racecourse line and between Sandringham and Prahran and Newmarket and Essendon, whilst good progress has been made with the work between Prahran and Newmarket and on the Williamstown line.

With the exception of minor details, the Jolimont car shed has been completed, and it is now equipped with overhead travelling cranes, but the delivery of the machine tools required for the overhaul and repair of the electric rolling-stock has been delayed by the war.

The General Electric Company continued to make satisfactory progress with the equipment of the Suburban Carriage Stock with the requisite electrical apparatus, and at 30th June, 158 trailer carriages had been fitted throughout, whilst the installation of the apparatus on 73 sliding-door and two swing-door motor coaches and 59 new underframes and bogies for swing-door motor coaches were in various stages of completion.

The first section of the plant at the Newport Power Station, comprising the boiler-house and its equipment, condensers, and turbo-alternators has been practically completed, whilst the switch and transformer house and offices and other buildings are approaching the final stages.

The total number of employees engaged on the work at 30th June was 1,160, and the expenditure which has been incurred during each financial year since the initiation of the scheme, exclusive of capital expenditure on the construction of new and the alteration of existing rolling-stock, is as shown hereunder :—

The commitments under the respective contracts as at 30th June amounted to approximately £2,450,000, which does not include the proportion chargeable in respect of automatic signalling and the subsidiary schemes for the electrical operation of the plant of the metropolitan workshops.

Automatic Signalling.

In pursuance of the scheme for the installation of automatic signalling throughout the Suburban lines, an electro-mechanical machine has been installed at South Yarra, and the automatic signals are now in actual operation between Richmond and Hawksburn on the Caulfield line, and Richmond and Prahran on the Sandringham line.

The signal mains for the extension of the automatic system have been laid between South Yarra and Sandringham, and trunking for the reception of the mains and cables has been provided on the Caulfield, Williamstown, Essendon, and Sandringham lines.

The rail joints upon 57½ miles of single track have also been bonded, so as to complete the return circuit for the power utilized both for automatic signalling and the operation of trains under electrification, on the sections from Flinders Street to Sandringham and Toorak, Spencer Street to Essendon and Williamstown, and Newport to the Williamstown Racecourse, and on the Flemington Racecourse line.

A considerable amount of preliminary work has been accomplished in fixing the location of signals and the preparation of plans, designs, and contracts, whilst designs have also been prepared and standardized for certain apparatus which will be manufactured in the Departmental workshops.

After careful investigation, it was decided to adopt, in conjunction with the automatic system, the "three-position" method of signalling, by which an indication is given to the train crews as to whether the line for two sections in advance is occupied or otherwise, and the installation is giving entire satisfaction on the sections where it is now in operation.

It is anticipated that the introduction of the automatic system of signalling will enable an appreciable saving to be effected in the operating cost, apart from the greater safety and facility in train working which will be achieved.

Newport Workshops.

The work of remodelling and enlarging the Newport Workshops has been held in abeyance owing to the necessity to curtail Capital expenditure, but some preliminary work in connexion with the earth formation and laying of tracks was proceeded with.

New Locomotive Workshops at Ballarat and Bendigo.

The main Workshop buildings are practically completed, but owing to the concentration of practically the whole energies of engineering works in Great Britain upon the manufacture of munitions, it has not been possible to secure a large quantity of the machinery and plant requisite for the equipment and operation of the Shops.

The machines, however, are gradually being delivered and their installation proceeded with, and it is anticipated that the new Workshops will be in partial operation about the beginning of 1917.

Regrading of the Camberwell Line.

Operations upon this work have been retarded by the necessity to limit the expenditure of capital funds, and the staff engaged upon it was in consequence appreciably reduced in February last, but steady progress has been made, and temporary lines have been constructed for the conduct of the traffic between Power-street, Hawthorn, and East Camberwell, whilst considerable progress has been made with the earthworks to admit of the construction of the line at its permanent level.

The diversion of the traffic to the temporary lines necessitated the construction of temporary stations at Glenferrie, Auburn, and Camberwell, and six temporary bridges have been constructed to admit of the carriage of material which is being obtained between Auburn and East Camberwell for the construction of the embankment between Hawthorn and Auburn.

The erection of the permanent station buildings at Auburn and Glenferrie has been commenced, and also the construction of the permanent bridges at Albert-street, Auburn-road, Henry-street, John-street, and William-street, at which the level crossings will ultimately be abolished.

Good progress has also been made with the provision of a retaining wall between Tara-street and Burwood-road, which varies from 17 feet to 24 feet in height, as well as with the drainage, water supply, and other subsidiary works.

Regrading and Duplication of the Caulfield Line.

The regrading and duplication of the line have been completed, and the duplicated tracks are in operation, but in consequence of the need for the exercise of economy it has not been possible to utilize the increased facilities to the full advantage, and so furnish the residents, particularly of the localities beyond Caulfield, with the additional conveniences which would have been afforded under normal conditions.

The erection of new station buildings on the street level at South Yarra will be completed within a few months.

Flinders-street Viaduct.

The duplication of the Viaduct has been completed, and the renewal and strengthening of the old structure is in progress. Between Market-street and King-street, the old girders and arches have been removed and the new piers, abutments, steelwork, and decking have been finished, whilst a commencement has been made with the demolition of the old arches between King-street and Spencer-street.

New Shipping Shed.

The original plans for the construction of this shed provided for a building 1,475 feet in length, but in view of the decision of the Melbourne Harbor Trust to provide vehicular access to the piers at Port Melbourne, which it is considered will involve a diversion of some of the traffic which otherwise would have been catered for by rail, it has been decided to erect a shed only 930 feet in length.

In consequence of the difficulty in obtaining the requisite steelwork, progress upon the main building has been retarded.

The new four-track three-span steel bridge over Montague-street has been completed, and the level crossing at Ferrars-street closed. The necessary retaining walls, diversions of right-of-way, alterations to gas and water mains, &c., have also been finished, and the main Port Melbourne lines regraded and diverted between Clarendon-street and Ingles-street.

Bulk Handling of Grain.

In fulfilment of an agreement entered into with the Honorable the Minister, a comprehensive report was furnished by Messrs. John S. Metcalf Company Limited in regard to the bulk handling of grain, after the representatives of the company had traversed practically the whole of the wheat-growing areas of the State, in company with Mr. C. Miscamble, Superintendent of Goods Train Service, and Mr. F. W. Box, Engineer, Way and Works Branch.

Subsequently the report was carefully analyzed by a Departmental Committee, and on 4th May last we advised the Honorable the Minister that, although not concurring in all respects with the conclusions arrived at in the report, we were satisfied that the proposed scheme was generally acceptable, and that it would be advantageous to establish a system of bulk handling of grain in Victoria.

Pilfering of Goods.

Continued efforts have been made to minimize the loss and inconvenience arising from the pilfering of goods, and a large staff of employees is engaged in the endeavour to detect offenders and prevent theft.

The following statement indicates the number of prosecutions before the courts, and of charges against employees which have been conducted before the Board of Discipline in cases in which the evidence was not sufficiently definite to support a criminal prosecution, during each of the past three years :—

Ticket Checking and Irregularities.

For some years past the ordinary methods of detecting persons travelling irregularly by rail have been supplemented by the employment of Special Checkers upon both Suburban and Country lines, as well as by the Conductors who are now employed on all main line country passenger trains, and whose duties include the checking of tickets, whilst "Flying Gangs" have also been utilized to a limited extent at Suburban stations.

The methods thus adopted, owing to the element of surprise in the case of the Special Checkers, and to the thoroughness of the check in the case of the Conductors, have resulted in the detection of a very large number of offenders, and the number of irregularities reported during the past two years is shown hereunder :—

Many of the irregularities so reported are of an entirely technical or trivial character, but in the more flagrant and serious cases the offending passengers have been prosecuted in the courts, and during last year 1,321 prosecutions of this character were conducted, and the Department was successful in securing a conviction in 1,300 instances.

The large number of irregularities which still occur indicates the necessity for the special measures which have been taken to safeguard the revenue of the Department, and affords every justification for the employment of the staff engaged upon this class of work.

Train Mileage and Train Loads.

The train services on a number of Country lines were curtailed as from September last, and, although in some instances the services were either wholly or partly restored in order to provide extra facilities during the summer months and for the increasing traffic, the train mileage of Country passenger and mixed trains was 450,373 miles less than that of the preceding year.

In October, 1915, the Suburban train service was also reduced, involving a saving of 427,024 train miles per annum, whilst as from 1st March, 1916, the service on the whole of the Suburban lines was re-arranged so as to equalize as far as practicable the intervals between trains during the slack and busy portions of the day respectively, and a further saving at the rate of 50,596 miles per annum was achieved. The reductions in the regular Suburban train service which were thus introduced during the year resulted in a saving of train mileage at the rate of 477,620 miles per annum, or equivalent to approximately 335,000 for the financial year, and whilst there was an increase in the mileage of military and other special trains, a reduction of 306,746 miles was actually achieved in the Suburban train mileage by comparison with the preceding year.

Despite the reductions in the train service, the revenue from the passenger traffic on Country lines increased by £171,901, but this amount includes the additional revenue derived from the higher fares which became effective on 1st October, and which it was estimated would increase the revenue from Country passengers to the extent of £82,500 per annum, or £68,750 for the financial year.

The Suburban passenger revenue also showed an increase of £10,805, but as a sum of approximately £40,275 was gained from the higher fares, there would but for that fact have been a decrease of £29,470. Investigation, however, discloses that the reduction in the train service was the cause of only a slight proportion of the decrease in traffic, and actually resulted in a net gain.

The goods train mileage decreased by 719,552 miles, despite the fact that the tonnage hauled was 419,790 tons in excess of the preceding year.

The total saving of 1,476,671 train miles by comparison with the preceding year is highly satisfactory, and whilst the value of this comparison is impaired by the abnormal conditions in 1914-15, a decrease was also achieved to the extent of 1,202,111 miles, by comparison with 1913-14, when normal conditions prevailed and the revenue was £144,205 less than last year.

The average load of mixed trains during the year was 70 per cent. of the authorized load over the ruling grades by comparison with 64 per cent. in the preceding year and 63 per cent. in 1913-14. Similarly, the average load of goods trains was 83 per cent. of the authorized load by comparison with 78 and 77 per cent. respectively in the two previous years.

Tramway Competition.

The operation of electric tramways within the Suburban Area has seriously affected the revenue of the Department, and from a comparison between the railway receipts before and after the construction of each tramway, it is estimated, after making allowance for the natural increase in revenue from the Suburban lines as a whole, that the loss per annum resulting from the competition of the electric tramways is as indicated hereunder :—

We realize the existence of a public need for the construction of some of these tramways, despite the competition with the railway service, but we strongly opposed the route proposed for other lines, and particularly that from Princes-bridge to Wallen-road, Hawthorn, in connexion with the tramway to Burwood. Between Hawthorn and the terminus at Burwood this tramway serves residents of a district who live comparatively remote from a railway, but we consider that the competition which has been created by the provision of the tramway in close proximity to, and parallel with the railway line between Burnley and Princes-bridge, and which is resulting in a large loss of railway revenue, was not justified by circumstances, inasmuch as it benefits a comparatively small number of people whilst the State as a whole has to bear the loss which the railways are sustaining.

So long as the existing principle governing the construction of tramways is continued the proposition that the railways should, in some degree, be compensated from the tramway receipts for the loss of revenue resulting from the competition of the trams, though open to criticism, is perhaps on the whole an equitable arrangement ; but we consider that the adoption of such a scheme should not be regarded as finally disposing of the problem arising from the conflicting interests of the railway and tramway systems, and that it is of vital importance that a close oversight should be established upon the construction and route of new tramways, in order that the money invested in the railway system may not be partially deprived of its reproductive capacity by the expenditure of public funds in the provision of tramway facilities in localities which are reasonably catered for by the railways.

There is no doubt that the tramways have secured traffic by the recent increase in Suburban fares, but we are opposed to any extension of the discrimination made in favour of certain localities where tramway competition was established a number of years ago, and we are convinced that on the whole the Department would lose rather than gain by a reduction of the existing fares, which, especially in the case of daily and monthly tickets, compare more than favorably with those in other States, as indicated by the following statement, whilst the rates for all classes

of periodical tickets, generally speaking, afford a cheaper means of transit than is available on the tramway systems:—

The loss of revenue resulting from the tramway competition could, we consider, be reduced by an appreciable improvement of the facilities now afforded by the Suburban railway service, but not to such an extent as to offset the additional expenditure involved. We confidently anticipate, however, that when the electrified services come into operation, and a speedy train service can be provided, and the number of trains during the slack portions of the day greatly increased at a relatively small cost, a fair proportion of the traffic which has been transferred to the trams will be regained by the Department.

Way and Works Branch.

The Way and Works were maintained in good working order and repair throughout the year, *vide* the certificate of the Chief Engineer in Appendix No. 2.

During the year 127 miles of track were relaid with steel rails, as indicated hereunder:—

of which 107·5 miles were relaid with heavier rails in order to provide serviceable steel rails for the construction of new lines of railway and new sidings.

The tracks were strengthened by 19,614 additional sleepers, 158,016 sleepers were renewed, and 97 miles of fencing were rebuilt.

Seven hundred and eight interlocked levers were installed at 28 places, making the total number of interlocked levers in use at 30th June 10,585 at 812 places, and the proportion of interlocked places 77·55 per cent.

One hundred and forty-seven sets of staff or Annett lock gear were provided at 85 intermediate non-staff stations, and 37 sets of plunger locking gear were installed at 24 staff stations.

The sections of line from Camberwell to East Camberwell, Hawthorn to Glenferrie, and between Posts Nos. 2 and 4 at Canterbury, as well as the Port Melbourne New Pier Line and the crossovers at the Down end of Bacchus Marsh station, were tracklocked.

Sixteen sections were equipped with electric staff, twenty-five were tracklocked, and three were fitted with Winter's Block apparatus.

Rolling Stock Branch.

The whole of the Rolling Stock in use, and the machinery and tools, were maintained in good working order and repair—*vide* the certificate of the Chief Mechanical Engineer, in Appendix No. 3; and inventories of the Rolling Stock in existence at 30th June, 1916, based on numbers and capacity, respectively, are embodied in Appendices Nos. 15 and 16.

In addition to the removal from the register of the Rolling Stock which was broken up, &c., during the year (*vide* Appendix No. 16), seventy carriages of obsolete type were written down from one-half to one-fourth of their internal floor area, and one hundred and fifty-eight trucks were reduced to the tonnage capacity represented by their value as scrap materials.

The contract for the first twenty "DD" class locomotives allotted in 1912 to Messrs. Thompson and Company, Castlemaine, was completed, and ten locomotives of their second contract were delivered, whilst a contract for a further twenty "DD" class engines has been let to this firm.

Contracts to the value of £28,882 were let to a number of Victorian firms for the supply of parts of Rolling Stock.

Two locomotives, one of the "DD" class and one of the "A2" class, were fitted with superheaters, and as they have fulfilled expectations in regard to economy in fuel and water consumption, arrangements have been made to similarly equip a number of additional locomotives.

The pattern consolidation locomotive, referred to in our last Report, for the haulage of goods traffic on main lines, is under construction at the Newport Workshops, and it is anticipated that it will be completed during the year.

Stores Branch.

The value of the Stock of Stores at 30th June, 1916, as per the certificate of the Chief Storekeeper (*vide* Appendix No. 4) was £1,022,196, or £66,037 in excess of the value of the Stock at 1st July, 1915.

The increase is to a large extent attributable to the higher prices of stores and materials, and to the necessity to hold sufficient stocks to safeguard the Department because of the difficulty in obtaining supplies under the present abnormal conditions.

Dining Car Service.

The Dining Car Service has been maintained to a satisfactory standard, and has yielded an appreciable increase in revenue, as will be observed from the following comparison of the receipts during the past three years :—

Munitions of War.

The manufacture of gauges and high explosive shells in the Munitions Shop at Newport was continued, and other experimental work in connexion with 4.5-in. and 6-in. shells was undertaken at the request of the Defence Department. The Munitions Shop has been a source of interest, and the methods in operation have been demonstrated to engineers and others in this and the adjoining States. In consequence, however, of the fact that some of the steel used in the manufacture of the shells was not considered to be of satisfactory quality, the percentage of shell cases finally accepted was much lower than was anticipated.

Munition work at Newport has, however, been discontinued in accordance with the desire of the Commonwealth Government, but the workshop, plant and staff are being profitably utilized in the performance of other work.

Ambulance Organization and Equipment.

Extended facilities have been afforded the staff to qualify in "First Aid," and the classes of instruction at the different centres have been well attended. A total of 3,893 employees now hold certificates of competency, and a large number of others, although they have not passed the prescribed tests, have gained useful knowledge and are competent to render "First Aid." Additional equipment, as will be seen from the following figures, has also been provided:—

The annual competitions between corps and individual employees respectively, from all parts of the State, were again successful, and the interest of the staff in these demonstrations, and their value as an incentive to qualify in First Aid, are indicated by the large number of entries, which were double the number in the previous year.

The Staff.

but as there was a loss of 379 employees in consequence of retirements, deaths, resignations, dismissals, &c., the net decrease in the permanent staff was 100.

At 30th June, 1916, there were 23,023 employees in the service, of whom 13,393 were attached to the permanent staff, and 9,547 were engaged in temporary capacities, in addition to 83 office cleaners and other female employees who enjoy all the privileges of permanency.

The number of supernumeraries was decreased by 3,990, due mainly to the restriction of expenditure upon works and rolling stock.

Despite the decrease in the number of supernumerary employees, it is recognised that the employment of so many men in a temporary capacity would under normal circumstances be undesirable, especially as a large proportion of those who have been retained occupy positions of a permanent character, but generally speaking, we consider that further permanent appointments should not be made until the expiration of the war, so that returned soldiers may receive the benefit of the preference for permanent appointment which has been conferred upon them by the provisions of Act No. 2184. So much difficulty and expense, however, have been occasioned by the temporary employment in a clerical capacity of men and youths whose training does not give them the necessary aptitude for this class of work, that we propose to invite applications at an early date for a number of permanent junior clerks. In addition, we intend to proceed with the appointment of a number of apprentices, in accordance with the usual custom, in sufficient time to admit of their commencing the theoretical portion of their training at the Working Men's College at the beginning of 1917.

The amount paid as Salaries and Wages respectively during the past three years to the staff, excluding men attached to co-operative labour parties, is as shown hereunder :—

The Staff and the War.

The manner in which the employees of the Victorian Railways have responded to the call for Volunteers for service abroad is indicated by the fact that out of a total of approximately 15,111 employees within the prescribed age limits, no fewer than 3,220 have been granted leave of absence to undertake Military service, so that the total number of enlistments represents 21.3 per cent. of the total number of employees of eligible age.

Such a record is highly creditable to the Staff, and demonstrates that the men of the Victorian Railways have a full sense of their responsibilities to the Commonwealth and to the Empire.

We regret that up to the present 104 employees are known to have been killed or to have died whilst on active service, and we desire to here place on record our sympathy with the relatives of the men who have sacrificed their lives for their country.

The names and avocations of the employees who have joined the Expeditionary Forces are embodied in this Report, *vide* page 27.

Patriotic and Red Cross, &c., Funds.

We again desire to place on record our appreciation of the splendid generosity of the employees in contributing to the different patriotic funds, and of the gratuitous services rendered by employees in patriotic movements throughout the State, and particularly by the men of the Arden-street workshops, in the manufacture of articles for Red Cross purposes, and the men of the Newport workshops in a similar direction and in the making of emblems for sale on behalf of different Patriotic Funds.

The subscriptions of employees amount to £32,169, and the money has been allocated to the different Funds as indicated hereunder :—

General Review.

In each of our Annual Reports of the past three years we have directed attention to the retrogression in the financial results of the railways, consequent, on the one hand, upon the gradual increase in the rates of pay of the staff, and, on the other hand, upon the reductions in freights and fares which have been made in recent years.

That retrogression has been remedied to some extent by the increased rights and fares which became operative as from 1st October last, and which had the effect of augmenting the revenue by approximately £260,000 per annum ; but

on the basis of the business of the year under review it is estimated that the total reductions in freights and fares since the year 1906 amount in value to £470,000 per annum, so that the gross revenue is still £210,000, per annum less than it would have been if the concessions in freights and fares since 1906 had not been granted.

On the other hand, there has been a steady advancement of the basic wage of employees, viz., from 6s. 6d. per day in 1905-6 to 8s. per day in 1914-15, and the classification of superior grades has been bettered in a more or less corresponding ratio, whilst since 1st July, 1915, the minimum remuneration for adult labourers has been raised to 8s. 6d. per day by the grant of an allowance of 6d.—or in some cases 1s.—per day, consequent upon the high cost of living arising from war conditions.

Moreover, the conditions under which the staff are employed as regards travelling and incidental expenses, payment for Sunday duty and overtime, and a number of other minor matters, have been liberalized, and an exhaustive analysis discloses that the value of the concessions granted to the staff since 1905-6 amounted in 1915-16 to no less than £752,978 of which £135,536 was chargeable to Capital, and £617,442 to Working Expenses.

In other words, if the Railways had been operated in 1915-16 under the same conditions as regards pay and conditions of employment as in 1905-6, the Working Expenses would have been less than is actually the case by £617,442.

The increase in the cost of labour, as well as in the price of materials generally, has not, of course, been confined to the Railways, but is common to practically all trade activities, and we feel that we cannot too strongly stress the point that such increases in outside businesses have invariably been followed by at least an equivalent increase in the price of the different classes of goods, &c., and that the higher wages bill has accordingly been borne by the consumer; whilst in the Railway Department, despite increased wages and improved conditions of employment which have affected the Working Expenses to the extent of £617,442 per annum in a period of ten years, the freights and fares have actually been *decreased* by £210,000 per annum in the same period.

It is obvious that under these circumstances the Railways cannot produce satisfactory financial results, but in appraising the operations of the Department these adverse and material influences are frequently, if not invariably, overlooked, and we desire to again point out, as mentioned in our last Report, that—

“The gradual, yet appreciable, increase in the percentage of working expenses to gross revenue which has occurred during the past few years has apparently led to the erroneous conclusion that the operations of the Department are not at present conducted as economically as in earlier years; but a comparison of the results of working of any two years is obviously not only fallacious, but valueless, unless the conditions are substantially alike in both periods, and in any contrast all the essential factors should obviously be taken into consideration in order to reach a logical conclusion.”

In order that a reasonable contrast may be presented, we append the following comparison between the results of working in 1905-6 and 1915-16 in respect of—

- (1) The revenue per traffic train mile: and
- (2) The percentage of working expenses to gross revenue,

which furnish a reasonable criterion of the economic administration of the Railways.

(1) REVENUE PER TRAFFIC TRAIN MILE.

This comparison is in itself satisfactory, but if the business of 1915-16 had been conducted with the same fares and freights as existed in 1905-6, the revenue for 1915-16, after allowing for the fact that certain of the concessions, which have been previously referred to, were operative in a portion of 1905-6, and that the increases in freights and fares were likewise operative for only a portion of last year, would have been increased by £225,000
 and would thus have amounted to £5,930,163
 and on this basis the revenue per traffic train mile would have been 8/6.93d.
 or an increase by comparison with the year 1905-6 of 6.14d.

(2) PERCENTAGE OF WORKING EXPENSES TO GROSS REVENUE.

In 1905-6 the working expenses (exclusive of Special and Abnormal Charges) were £1,999,023
 and the percentage of working expenses to gross revenue was 52.78
 whilst in 1915-16 the working expenses (exclusive of Special and Abnormal Charges) were £3,705,148
 and the percentage of working expenses to gross revenue was 64.94
 so that the percentage of working expenses to revenue in 1915-16 increased by contrast with 1905-6 to the extent of 12.16

For comparative purposes, however, a deduction representing the value of concessions to the staff during the period of ten years should be made, and which, excluding the proportion allocated to Special and Abnormal Charges, amounted to £575,533 as well as for the increased price of coal, which represented a sum of— £111,622
 or a total deduction for the year of £687,155
 thus leaving for comparative purposes a sum of £3,017,993

On the basis of this figure (£3,017,993) for working expenses, and of a revenue of £5,930,163, which would have been earned in 1915-16 if the fares and freights operative in 1905-6 were also effective in 1915-16, the percentage of working expenses to gross revenue in 1915-16 would have been 50.89
 by contrast with the percentage in 1905-6 of 52.78
 or a decrease of 1.89

In this comparison only the principal influences upon the results of working have been taken into consideration, and we, of course, realize that the heavy expenditure which has been incurred in the construction of superior locomotives and trucks and the provision of improved working facilities has materially improved the reproductive value of the railway system; but the effect of such factors is fully off-set by other items, which have also been excluded from the comparison, such as the largely increased price of all stores and materials, the more than proportionate increase in the cost of maintenance and repair of Rolling Stock by comparison with the business transacted owing to the provision of a more adequate supply of Rolling Stock, the construction of a large mileage of new lines which at the outset cannot be expected to produce a profit, the carriage at half rates of Military and Naval traffic producing a revenue of £119,034, as against a sum of only £10,045 (which included some traffic carried at two-thirds rates) in 1905-6, and a number of other minor causes.

The foregoing comparison clearly demonstrates that the retrogression in the financial results is due, not to any failure or extravagance in operation or administration, but simply to two main factors, viz., the net deductions in fares and freights and the higher average payments to the staff.

At the same time the deficits which have resulted during the past two years are matters for serious concern, and naturally occasion anxiety as to the expectations of the future; but the conditions at the present time are so abnormal, and a return to anything like past conditions is so much a matter of conjecture, that it is impossible to predict whether the existing fares and freights can again be relied upon to cover the Working Expenses and Interest Charges.

Apart from the uncertainty as to the scale of wages which will operate after the conclusion of the war—and which will depend to a large extent on the cost of living—the period of excessively heavy expenditure on works of varying magnitude involving considerable debits against Working Expenses will in all probability appreciably decrease within two or three years, whilst the outlay on the electrification of the Suburban Railways, which in addition to the charges against Capital has necessitated a considerable debit to Working Expenses and a very large increase in the Interest Charges, will, as the electrified lines come into operation, become revenue producing, and bearing those factors in mind, the prospects of the future are decidedly more promising than the present.

In the years prior to 1905-6, when a series of deficits occurred, the then existing freights and fares were not increased in order to balance the Railway finances, and surpluses were subsequently achieved which helped materially to eliminate the previous losses; and in view of the financial stability of the State we are of opinion that this course should again be adopted, and that the existing freights and fares should be retained until such time as the present abnormal conditions disappear and a more reliable forecast can be made of the financial results of operation.

In the meantime, however, it will be incumbent on us to conduct the business of the Department in the most economical manner possible, and so long as the abnormal conditions prevail, it is our intention to continue to afford only such facilities as are absolutely necessary for the traffic, to withhold that measure of added convenience which might reasonably be expected in normal times, and to only sanction expenditure upon new works and improvements in station and other accommodation which are essential for the traffic and efficient working.

A close purview will continue to be exercised on the train mileage and on the train loads so that improved results may continue to be achieved, and for some time past an officer has been solely engaged in watching the movements of mixed and goods trains, particularly at depôt and roadside stations, in order to minimize delays and obviate “standing” time and thus save expense in operation. In addition a committee of officers has been engaged in an investigation of the work performed by the clerical staff in the Head Offices, the workshops, and the principal metropolitan and country depôts, with a view to the simplification of methods, concentration of work, increase of efficiency and curtailment of expenditure.

In our previous Report we expressed accord with the principle of the construction of new lines which would tend to open up new areas and develop the resources of the State, because we realize that the observance of a sound policy of construction must be productive of beneficial results, and that a loss in the earlier years is not too great a price to pay for the advantages which will be subsequently gained; but we desire to invite attention to the paucity of settlement in many districts contiguous to existing as well as to new lines, and to urge that an endeavour be made to develop such areas in the interests of the Railways and of the State generally.

State Coal Mine.

A profit of £1,589 os. 4d. resulted from the operation of the State Coal Mine during the year, after making allowance for interest and depreciation charges and a contribution to the sinking fund.

The gross output of coal for the year amounted to 452,799 tons, of which quantity 275,658 tons were consumed by this Department, 12,318 tons were disposed of to other public Departments, and 145,546 tons of slack coal were sold to the public. The balance of 19,277 tons is accounted for by local consumption, sales to miners, waste, &c.

The Mine furnished employment to an average number of 1,015 employees, and the total sum expended in wages for the year was £159,065, the net average earnings of the miners, after deducting the cost of explosives and lights, amounting to 14s. 6½d. per day.

During the year the Mine was closed, owing to strikes or stop-work meetings, for 36 days, resulting in a reduction in the time worked by the men of approximately 30,000 shifts representing £14,460 in wages, and also decreasing the output of coal by 62,900 tons.

The output of coal was also adversely affected by the enlistment of a number of skilled miners, and the inability to obtain the services of competent men elsewhere.

Acknowledgment of Services of Staff.

We have pleasure in recording the fact that the Officers and Employees continued to perform their duties in a satisfactory manner, and we desire to express our appreciation of the valued assistance and good service which they have rendered.

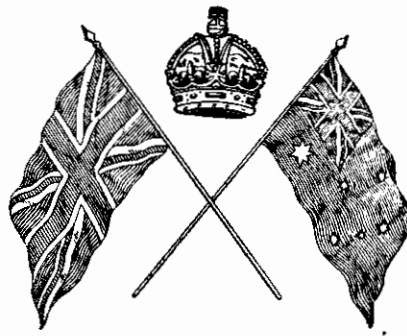

AVERAGE MILEAGE OPERATED

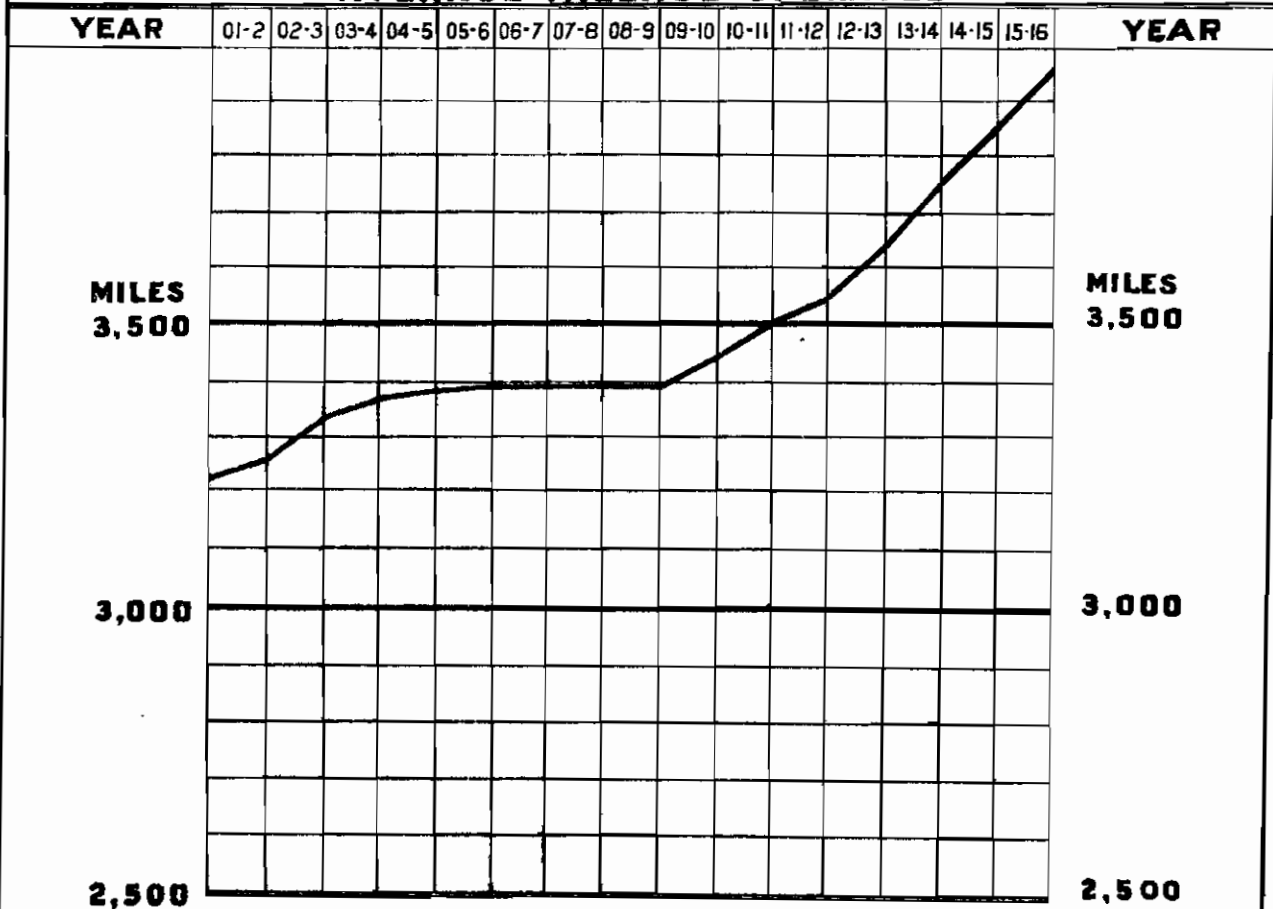


DIAGRAM N° 2

AVERAGE COST OF CONSTRUCTION PER MILE

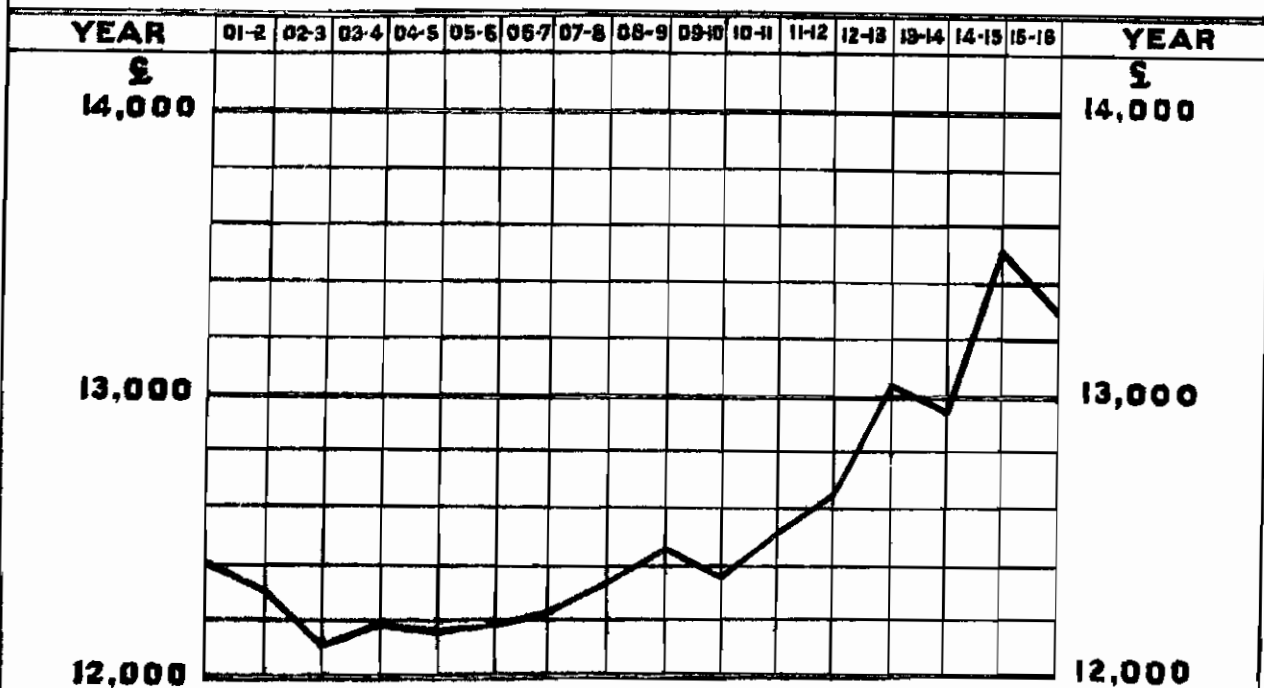

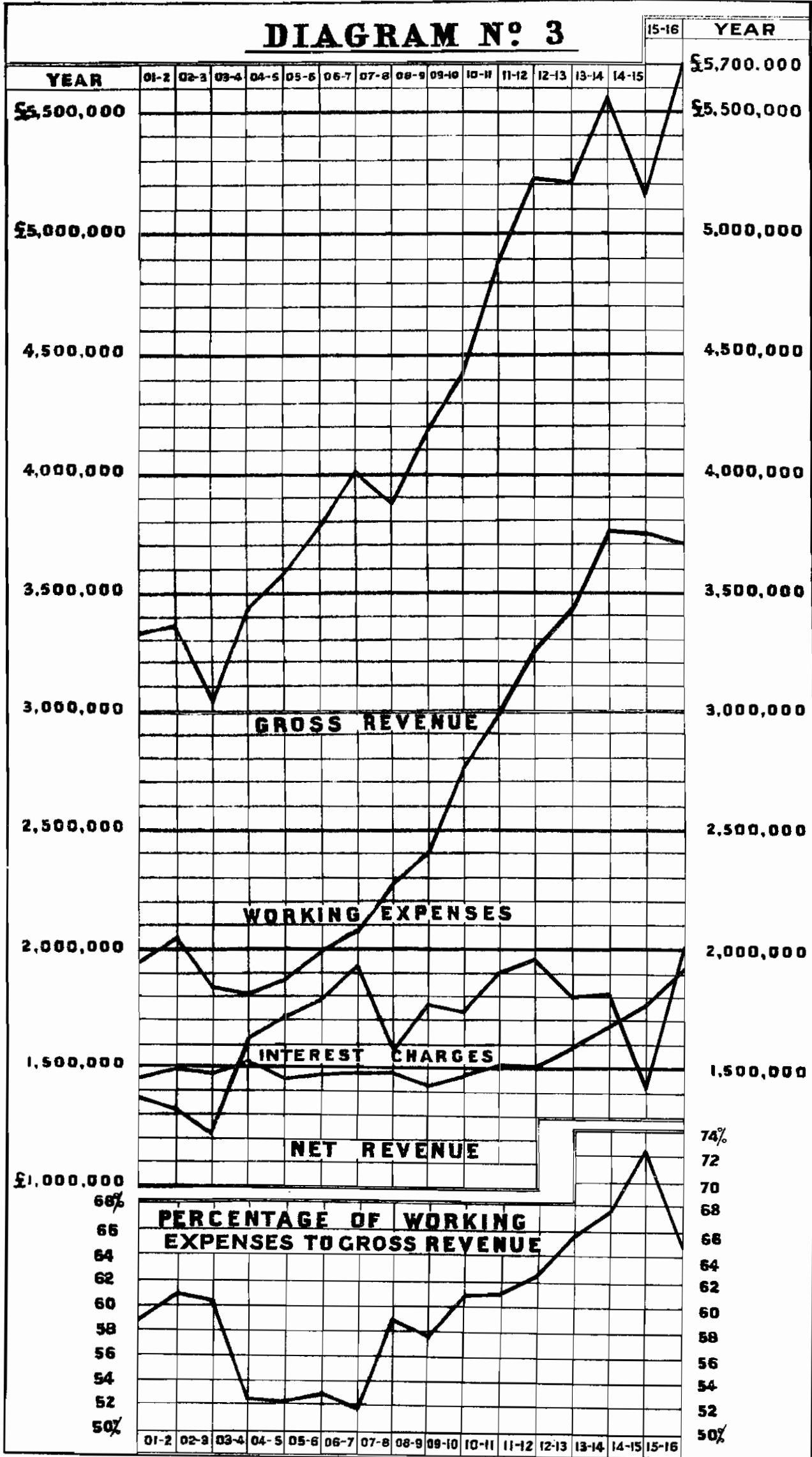


DIAGRAM N° 4

PER AVERAGE MILE OF RAILWAY OPEN

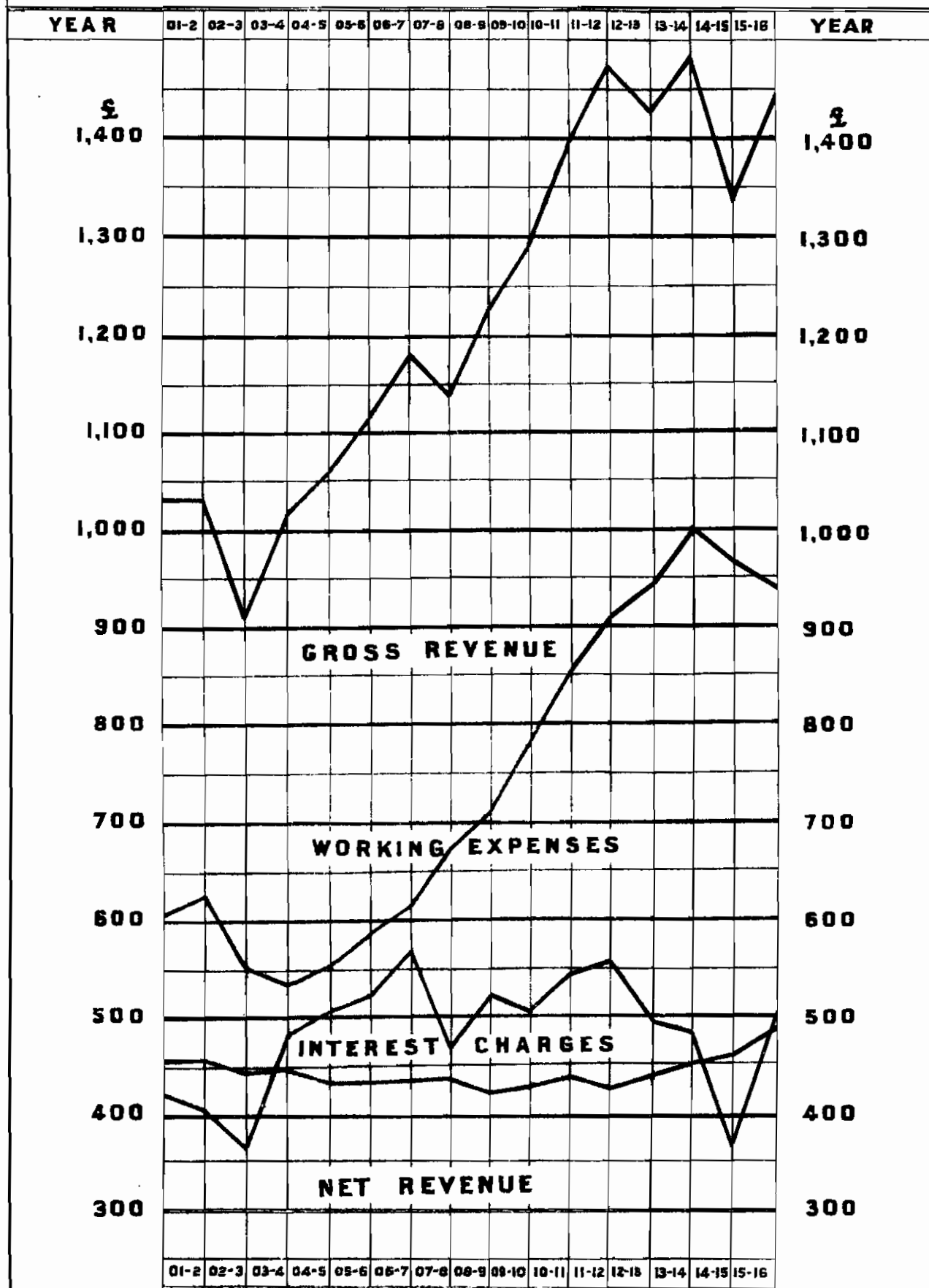
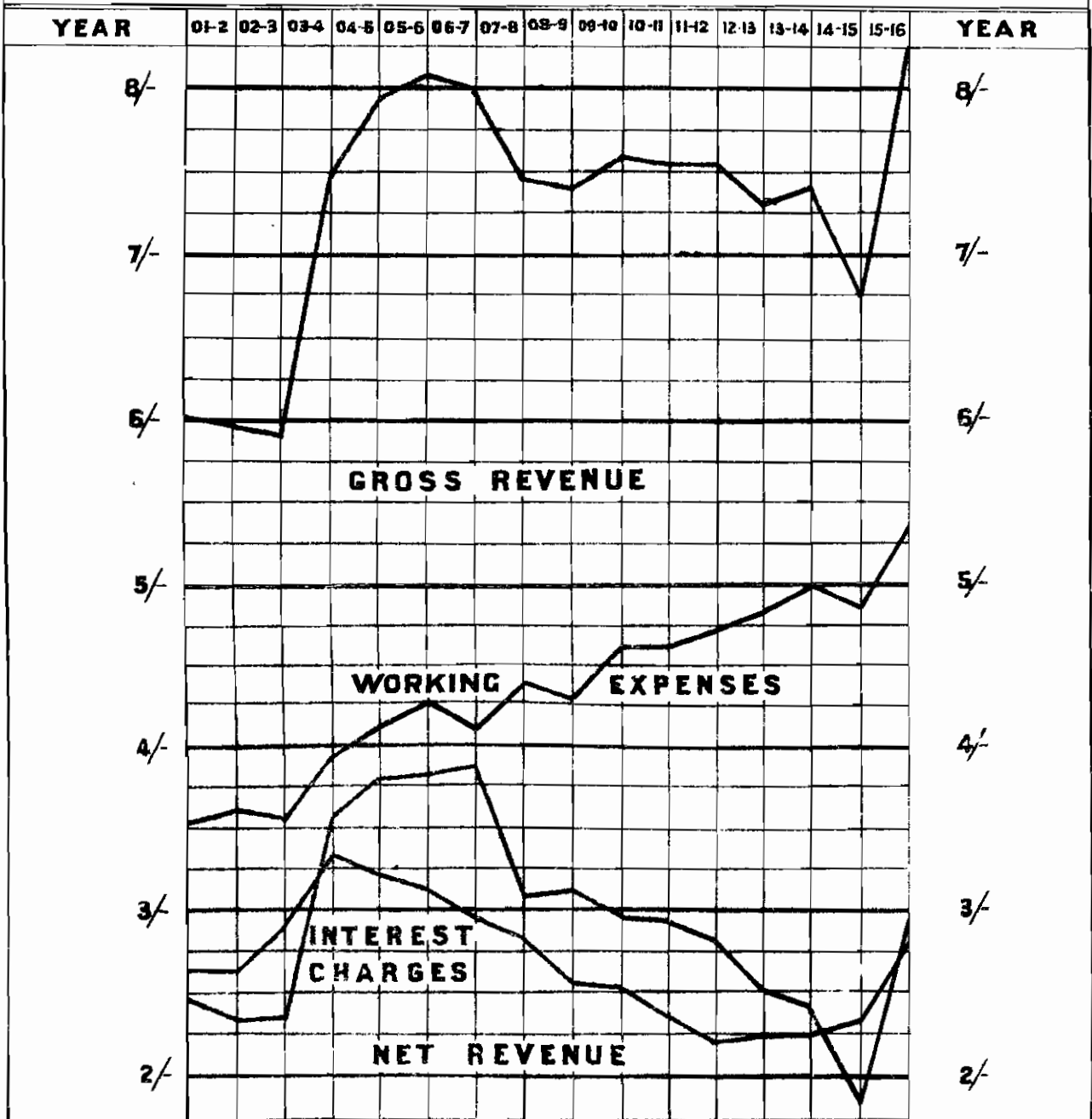

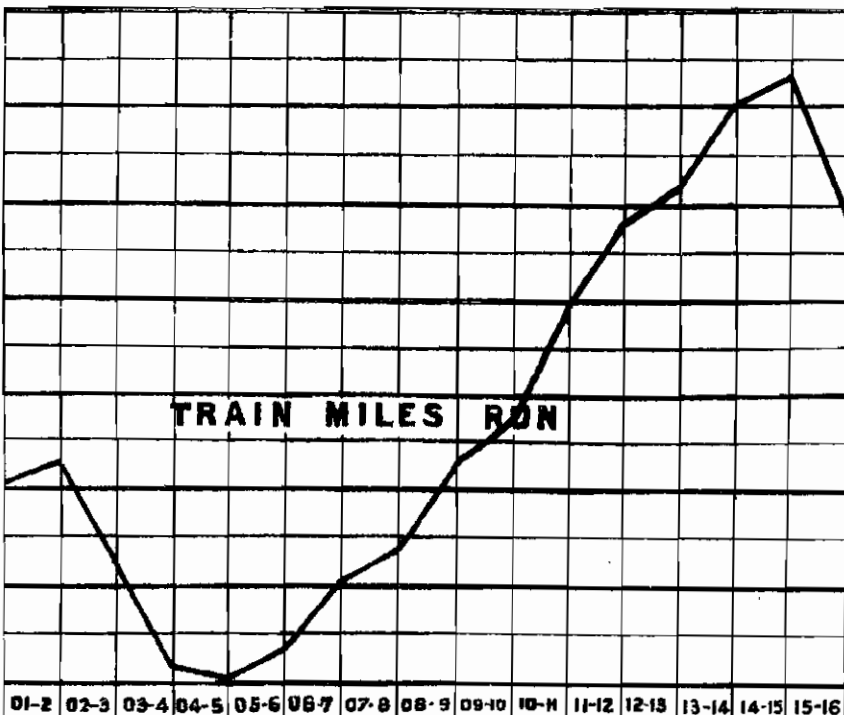
